The New Media Institute explores all aspects of innovative new media technology. The New Media Certificate is a credential proving that you're "technowledgeable". Certificate holders can apply new media skills in a chosen field and are provided opportunities to network with industry professionals, making connections that lead to jobs.

Why earn the certificate?

The New Media Certificate offers immediate and meaningful campus and community involvement. Hand-on classroom environments spark lasting friendships and communities among students and faculty alike. NMI classes aim to be unique to each individual and skills taught are able to enhance any primary field of study.

How do I earn the certificate?

The certificate is earned while completing a bachelors degree in any chosen field and is open to all majors. The certificate can be started at any time and takes 1 to 2 years to complete, depending on elective choices. To earn the certificate, a student must complete 17 credit hours and earn a B or higher in each class.
